

Since 1999, STOP SHORT of Addiction has provided alcohol and drug services to Orange County youth and families. This unique substance abuse intervention targets youth offenders, ages 12 to 18, who are in the early stages of drug use. Parental participation in the program is mandatory. The overwhelming success of STOP SHORT of Addiction is due, in large part, to the fact that we incorporate families into our program services. Youth, together with their families, gain the tools needed to prevent them from regressing back to unhealthy and destructive behaviors.

STOP SHORT of Addiction is based on our award-winning SHORTSTOP program. It serves as an effective alternative to incarceration, providing education to both youth and parents on the legal aspects of drug-related offenses and the negative lifestyle consequences of substance abuse. Parents gain a better understanding of the signs, symptoms, and behaviors associated with drug use. As a result, they are better able to recognize and address any future problems as soon as possible.

STOP SHORT of Addiction is administered by bilingual, bicultural staff, with assistance from legal experts, the Sheriff's Coroner and local law enforcement narcotics officers. Guest speakers are also provided from the Youth Guidance Center and Volunteers on Parole. Services are offered in both English and Spanish.

STOP SHORT of Addiction provides youth and family members with the following:

Intake Assessment (2 hours)

The intake gathers critical information about the youth's drug history, at-risk behaviors, school functioning, emotional stability, and family dynamics.

Three (4-hour) Substance Abuse Sessions

Program sessions focus on providing legal and substance abuse education, group discussions, and healthy communication and coping skills to maintain a drug-free lifestyle. Session highlights include visiting a courtroom to hear incarcerated minors discuss how drug use led them to criminal activity and incarceration, a County Coroner presentation illustrating the biological and psychological effects of drug abuse, and a panel of recovered teens that discuss the choice to stay drug-free.

Our Impact

STOP SHORT of Addiction makes a measurable difference in the lives of local youth and families and to the well-being of our community.

Mandatory Assignments

A critical part of STOP SHORT of Addiction is what happens at home. Youth read substance abuse prevention materials, engage in family communication exercises, complete goal-setting assignments, explore future career paths by interviewing a working professional in the community, and attend two AA or NA meetings.

Wellness Checks and Food Resources

Program staff conducts wellness checks with our current, past, and upcoming clients, and offers access to our monthly food drives.

Exit Plan and Case Management/ Referral Services

An individualized exit plan is created for each youth after completing the program. If needed, youth and families may also receive case management and linkages to partner agencies that provide additional behavioral health and substance abuse services





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
